The main house of the Grimm-Schultz Farmstead was built by Henry Grimm for his



wife, Caroline Graff, and family in 1875, although the second floor, central lintel notes 1880 as the year completed. The property is located one-half mile southwest of the former railroad town of Volland, Kansas and 8 miles southwest of Alma, Kansas.



In 2020, the Farmstead was added to the National Register of Historic Places.
